

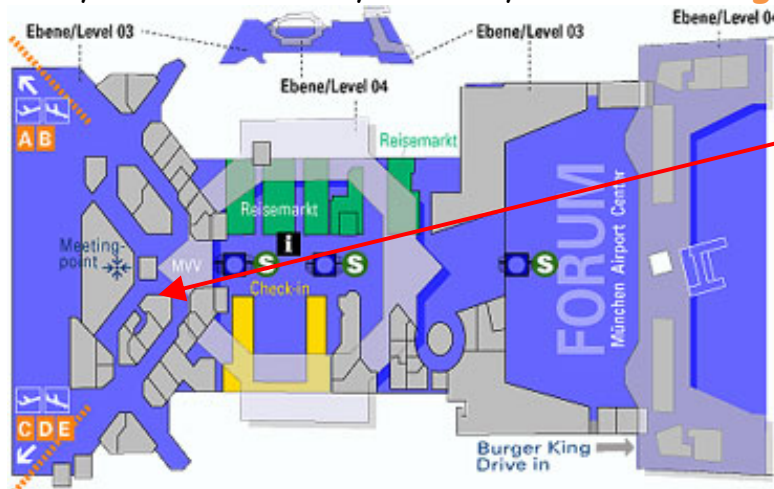

**Additional Information:** Germany's oldest university is **die Universität Heidelberg**, which was founded in 1386. The university in Cologne (Köln) followed two years later. Most of Germany's other universities date back to the 15th and 16th centuries. In those times a university usually had only three colleges or schools (**Fakultäten**): law, medicine and theology. After the introduction of philosophy, other fields were also added over the years. The 1700s and 1800s saw the introduction of the TH (**Technische Hochschule**) in half a dozen German cities from Berlin to Stuttgart. Most of Germany's newer universities and technical colleges were established in the 1970s. Below are the major types of German institutions of higher learning.

**Additional Information:** To ensure that you remain mobile with public transport once you reach your destination, we offer special "Laender-Tickets" in cooperation with many of the Federal Laender, to make your holiday even less expensive. Laender-Tickets can be used by up to 5 persons. They can be used for one day for 2nd class travel on Deutsche Bahn local trains (**IRE, RE, RB and S-Bahn**) and on services operated by the participating transport associations. IR trains can also be used subject to payment of a supplement of EUR 13.00.

Tariffs, conditions of use and scope of validity may vary between the individual Laender-Tickets. Laender-Tickets are valid from Monday to Friday, from 9:00 h to 3 h of the following day (on bank holidays for the whole day).

## Länder-Tickets You would like to travel for a whole day during the week?

In that case one of our Länder-Ticket is your best choice. You can use the ticket with up to five people and you can book the ticket online.

Travel in the Bundesland (federal state) of your choice. Most Länder-Tickets are valid also on Saturday and Sunday. They are valid from Monday to Friday for one day of your choice from 9 a.m. until 3 a.m. of the following day (on bank holidays for the whole day). Some tickets can also be used for nighttime travel, they are valid from 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. the next morning.

The ticket is only valid for one day in 2<sup>nd</sup> class.

It can be used on all local trains (Interregio-Express, Regional-Express, Regionalbahn, S-Bahn) and the entire transport system of the Verkehrsverbände. In some Bundesländer you can buy a supplement of EUR 13 to be able to take IR- or D-trains. Tariffs, terms and conditions can vary.

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### **Bayern-Ticket (Bavaria-Ticket)**

Package price EUR 27 if you buy your ticket online or at the ticket machine. EUR 29 if you purchase your ticket at the ReiseZentrum.

This ticket is valid from Monday to Sunday for one day of your choice from 9 a.m. until 3 a.m. of the following day (on bank holidays for the whole day) on Saturday and Sunday and bank holidays from from 0 a.m. until 3 a.m. of the following day. It can be used on all local trains (Interregio-Express, Regional-Express, Regionalbahn, S-Bahn) and the entire transport system in Bavaria as well as the Münchner Verkehrsverbund (MVG) and Verkehrsverbund Nürnberg (VGN), Tarifverbundes (AVV) and many more.

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## Hofbräuhaus am Platzl

The state-owned Hofbräuhaus is the world's most famous beer hall. The present Hofbräuhaus was built in 1897, but the tradition of a beer house on this spot dates from 1589. In the 19th century, it attracted artists, students, and civil servants, and it was called the Blue Hall because of its dim lights and smoky atmosphere. When it grew too small to contain all the patrons who wanted to come here, architects designed another, in 1897. Today, 4,500 beer drinkers can crowd in here on any given night. Several rooms, including a top-floor room for dancing, are spread over three floors. With its brass band (which starts playing at 11am), the ground-floor Schwemme is most typical of what you probably expected--here it's eternal Oktoberfest. In the second-floor restaurant, strolling musicians entertain, and dirndl-clad servers offer mugs of beer between sing-alongs. Every night the Hofbräuhaus presents a typical Bavarian show in its Fest-Hall, starting at 8pm and lasting until midnight. (This was also the 1920 setting for the notorious meeting of Hitler's newly launched German Workers Party, when a brawl erupted between the Nazis and their Bavarian enemies.) The entrance fee is 5€, and the food is the same as that served in other parts of the beer palace. A liter of beer costs 5.50€ here; meals run 6.50€ to 15€. The hall is open daily 9am to midnight.
